

Professor Roger Petersen's new book is a 'careful rethinking' of the Iraq War

MIT SSP faculty member Roger Petersen recently released a new book, published by Oxford University Press, on the US invasion and occupation of Iraq. *Death, Dominance, and State Building: The US in Iraq and the Future of American Military Intervention* dives into the sectarian tensions, ethno-religious dynamics, and local security developments that characterized this tumultous period of Iraqi history and US foreign policy. Drawing on extensive field research and interviews with Iraqi and American personnel, Petersen illuminates many new sides of the occupation and explores how it affected the prospects of future American efforts at counter-insurgency and state-building.
